Spiritual Growth Continues in

God's Pod

The following article is an update on a prison dorm we wrote about in 2012.

Inmates facing the death penalty usually have nothing left to lose. But they often have lots to gain. That was the case for one inmate in God's Pod, the nickname for a faith-based dorm at Lea County Correctional Facility in Hobbs, New Mexico. Chaplain Joseph Brazil just wrote a letter of recommendation for him after he spent a year in the pod.

"We've seen a marked improvement in his life," Brazil said. "I believe that this program has really helped him to see things through spiritual eyes. He was at the bottom

of the barrel, but he came into the program and saw that his future is in God's hands. And that has really given him a purpose no matter what happens. He's been very diligent in the studies and really taken it to heart."

One of the studies the inmates in God's Pod participate in is provided by Christian Library International. The Leadership Bible Study is designed to help inmates grow closer to God as they learn to disciple others around them. Currently, there are 60 inmates enrolled in the program in God's Pod. Brazil estimated that since they started the curriculum in 2011, about 75 percent of participants have received a certificate of completion.

"I personally want to thank you for the Leadership course, which I just completed," wrote inmate George. "It seriously helped my growth in Christ and development as a leader."

Along with the Leadership Bible Study, CLI also provides the prison with Bibles and books. All prisoners who don't have access to a study Bible receive one upon completion of the study. During the last few years, the men in the pod have started writing book reports on what they're reading, and, recently, they've started using the Bibles to give summaries of Bible passages.

"Please let everyone involved know how much the study Bibles were appreciated," George continued. "It absolutely amazes me that 25 criminals (children of God) could be so joyous over Bibles. Thank you so much for caring and for loving us. People are still switching and swapping Bibles to get their favorite!"

Brazil said that the men in the pod typically do about five to six different studies a week. He likes the Leadership Bible Study because it not only teaches about salvation but also shows the inmates how to grow their relationships with Christ.

"I've seen a tremendous growth," Brazil said. "The ones that really take it serious, it does take root in their lives. They're surrounded by people who sharpen them. They're studying the Scripture and are surrounded by people who are doing the same."

We recently developed a new Bible study for inmates! Students began enrolling in this correspondence course late last year. To date, 381 prisoners have completed the introductory study and have received handsome certificates. Currently, 939 inmates are



The "Who Is God?" study is designed to help prisoners know God through His attributes. As the author of the study, I felt led to choose five of God's characteristics that He reveals in Scripture. For example, there is one lesson each on God's goodness, mercy, love, Some scholars list as many as 28 attributes of God gleaned from the Bible. Wouldn't it be

a blessing to study all 28? Yes, it would! However, I wanted to start our inmates with a simpler study and one that could be easily completed. We have two other studies that are more in-depth and take longer to complete. In addition, I felt these five attributes would have

The fifth or last lesson is "God Is Holy." I wanted to end the study on God's holiness because it's one characteristic that we tend to gloss over. We'd much rather talk about God's love, for example. But holiness is just as important as all His other traits. God is always love and He is always holy. He is set apart, pure and sacred.

Therefore, whether we are in prison or not, we are to fear God and bring Him glory because He is holy. He alone deserves our total allegiance and worship. In the end, all nations will come and worship before God and acknowledge His righteous acts.

Believers in prison are called to follow Jesus and be holy. God calls us to do the same. Let's obey God when He says, Be holy, because I am holy [1 Peter 1:16].


